There is also a new type of coronavirus which started recently called COVID 19. Its symptoms are a regular cold, sneezing or cough, runny nose or fever too.


Madam, is it true that COVID 19 does not affect children?




That is not true Temba. COVID 19 can affect anyone.

The only difference is that older people or those who are already sick or weak can get worse if they get affected. These people need help to get well if affected with COVID 19.










People with COVID-19 may experience a wide range of symptoms, from mild to severe illness.

- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache

- Vomiting



All about COVID-19

COVID-19 virus is not a living organism but a protein molecule (RNA or DNA) covered by a protective layer of fat, which is easily absorbed in to the body through the cells of the eyes, nose or mouth and it mutates and converts into aggressor and multiplier cells.

The virus CANNOT go through healthy skin.

The COVID-19 virus is very fragile; the only thing that protects it is a thin outer layer of fat and that is the reason why soap or satirizers with over 65% alcohol are the best weapon.

COVID-19 on average takes 5–6 days from infection to the symptoms showing.

Symptoms include fever, dry cough, tiredness, aches and pains, sore throat, diarrhoea, runny nose, headache, loss of taste or smell, a rash on skin, difficulty breathing or shortness of breath, chest pain or pressure, loss of speech or movement.

Seek immediate medical attention.

COVID-19 vaccination

Vaccines are medicines that are given to people to protect them against vaccine preventable diseases.

What is a COVID-19 vaccine?

It is a vaccine that is intended to provide immunity against COVID-19 and is being rolled out through a nationwide vaccination programmes.

Why should I get vaccinated?

Vaccines will help protect you and those around you against COVID-19.

Who can get vaccinated?

Nearly everyone can get vaccinated, but it will be conducted in phases. Phase one caters for COVID-19 frontline workers. Phase two targets the elderly & people with pre-existing conditions. Phase three targets the remainder of the eligible population. COVID-19 vaccines will be provided free of to all.

Are vaccines safe to use?

Yes. Vaccines are safe and have been in use for many years in Zimbabwe.

Will I be forced to take the COVID 19 vaccine? Vaccination will be voluntary and provided free of charge.
